



It is an interesting thing about all this digital content and social distancing, etc. The drawbacks may be obvious enough, but it really is not an imposition or in any way intimidating. All through this past year we have seen God working behind the scenes in surprising ways to draw people to the fundamental hope found in the person of Jesus Christ. So, let's pray that a couple of keystrokes and a few mouse clicks could be used by a God of wonders to ignite a spiritual fire in the hearts of our seeking friends, neighbours and even the person we just met the other day, because everyone needs to know that the journey can be joy filled when it's with Jesus.





I was really looking forward to Passover. It had been a very good year, and the people in the city of Jerusalem were making plans for their meal. My friends and I had our food and drink; we were going to be together in my little apartment. At Passover we would remember the Exodus where God freed us (Israelites) from slavery in Egypt. The tradition of Passover is prescribed in the book of Exodus in the Old Testament. We would read from the Torah. And we would eat our meal drinking four cups of wine. Then tell the story to remember what our forefathers went through and thank God for delivering us from the bondage of slavery. But this year much more was going to happen here in Jerusalem.

Jesus of Nazareth had come to town. He came into the city riding on a donkey colt. Many people lined the road into Jerusalem and hailed Him as King as he came. He had been all over the countryside performing miracles and everyone was excited, everyone except the Pharisees. He was a big threat to them. He called Himself the Son of God. They wanted him dead. And that's exactly what happened. The Pharisees got the Romans to crucify Jesus on a crude wooden cross on a hill outside of the city walls.

Jesus' disciples told me later how it all happened and how Jesus came back to life three days later. They said that Jesus had washed their feet at Passover in an upper room and that they had eaten bread and drank wine as a symbol of His body and blood, and that we were to do this to remember Him. It was to be the beginning of what would become a new tradition.

I now celebrate this new tradition. I remember Jesus' life and what He did for all of us by taking the sins of the entire world to the cross. I remember His Words; I remember His teaching. Most of all I remember His Love for us. His body the Bread, His blood the wine sacrificed for all who will believe that He Is the Son of God. What a wonderful new tradition to celebrate, we call it EASTER.

# **Egg-cellent Lemon Sugar Cookies**

1 stick unsalted butter 2 tsp vanilla

½ cup sugar 2 ¼ cup all-purpose flour

¼ tsp salt

**Decorating Icing** 

Also: 1 large egg

1 tbsp light corn syrup 2 ½ and 3 ½" egg shaped cookie cutters, yellow gel

food colour, and decorating sugar 1 Tbsp grated lemon zest

### **Directions**

- Beat butter, sugar and salt in a large bowl with mixer on medium-high until light and fluffy, about 3 minutes.
- Reduce speed to medium and add egg; beat until combined. Beat in corn syrup, lemon zest and vanilla. Reduce speed to low and add flour in two parts. Shape dough into two disks, wrap and refrigerate 1 hour.
- Heat oven to 350°F. Roll out 1 disk between 2 sheets of wax paper to 1/4 in. thick. Remove top layer of wax paper and cut out shapes using cookie cutters. Transfer to a baking sheet and bake for 12 minutes or until cookies are golden. Transfer cookies to wire rack and cool completely.
- Decorating Icing: In a large bowl, with mixer on low speed, beat 1 lb. confectioners' sugar and 3 Tbsp of egg whites. Add 6 Tbsp water; beat until blended. Increase mixer speed to high and beat 8 minutes or until icing is very thick and white. Makes 2 1/2 cups.
- Divide decorating icing into 2 bowls. Tint one yellow. Transfer half of each color to separate pastry bags fitted with plain writing tips. Thin the remaining icing with a few teaspoons water to the consistency of slightly whipped cream. Spread thinned icing over cookies; let dry completely. Decorate with icing in pastry bags, sprinkle with decorating sugar.

#### Lois:



As you speak through creation and your word, we ask that you might possibly even use our lives, to announce the good news of the Easter message to a world in need of hope. That is Jesus, our only hope.







The supplies for these colorful Easter eggs can be found in your kitchen pantry. here's what you'll need...

- hard boiled eggs or blown out eggs
- liquid food coloring
- uncooked rice, about 1/2 cup per color
- plastic baggies or containers with lids for less waste

#### PREPARING TO DYE EGGS WITH RICE...

If you're using hard boiled eggs get them out of the fridge and let them return to room temperature. Sweaty eggs are much harder to color!

Fill each bag or container with a half cup of rice. This doesn't need to be exact. Let your kiddos help!

Then add 6-8 drops of liquid food coloring. Close the container and shake or squish the rice to evenly distribute the food coloring throughout the rice.

SHAKE THOSE EASTER EGGS....

Once the food coloring has been distributed throughout the rice add one egg to the container. Gently shake, roll, or squish the egg. Everywhere the colored rice touches the egg will leave behind a colored mark resulting in a beautifully colored, textured egg.

Remove the egg from the bag and set aside to dry.

LAYERING COLORS ON EASTER EGGS...

It can be tempting to add multiple colors of food coloring to each bag of rice to create custom colors for your egg. Instead, I suggest layering colors right on the egg!

After the first layer of color has been shaken on and has had time to dry add your egg to a second bag of colored rice and shake! This process works the best when the first color is lighter than the second color. This results in a really pretty mottled color effect.

In the community garden we are hoping to plant a pumpkin patch for the young at heart, some pickling cukes for a jarring day, a pile of potatoes for a big fish fry with fresh cut fries, flowers for our Prayer and Care Team to deliver and a whole variety of other exciting things.
